Responsible for managing public complaints the department also seeks to protect the BPS from all forms of corruption through the application of vetting, policy and intelligence led activity. The department is answerable to the Deputy Commissioner of Police in their role as appropriate authority for the service.

The successful Applicant must have an extensive track record as a senior officer in the field of police professional standards with an understanding on all aspects of the police complaints system, dealing with misconduct and unsatisfactory performance and attendance procedures. Additionally an applicant is sought with experience in the implementation and direction of anti-corruption practice and investigations. Finally, given the need to engage and lead officers and staff, an applicant is sought with outstanding communication and leadership skills.

Additional to the above the role will assist work in Bermuda's departments of Customs and Corrections (Prison Service) to implement required anti-corruption policy and procedures.
