No proceedings may be instituted for this offence before the end of the period of 28 days from receipt of this summons.

You may apply in writing to the Magistrates' Court to extend the period to pay this penalty by up to an additional 28 days. This application must be in writing and made at least 48 hours before the expiry of the original 28 days from the receipt of this summons.

If you do not pay this penalty within 28 days (or such longer period as you are granted by the court), you are liable to prosecution for this offence and must appear in court on the date stated in this summons. Failure to appear in court as required may result in a warrant being issued for your arrest.

If you do pay this penalty within 28 days (or such longer period as you are granted by the court), you will not be convicted of this offence and do not need to appear in court.
